Public Meeting Scheduled to Discuss Potential Relocation of Allentown Main Post Office – Rescheduled for March 28.

What: The U.S. Postal Service is proposing to relocate the Allentown Main Post Office, 442 W. Hamilton Street, to a site in the immediate area of the existing Post Office. The proposal will be discussed at a public meeting, March 28 at the Allentown Council Chambers, 435 Hamilton Street, Allentown.

The meeting was originally scheduled for March 7 but is being postponed due to weather concerns.
